Morning Dave

I spoke to Colin and they are aware of this situation, as we previously received a similar complaint as a TIP call, which has been concluded. Colin will update the CRM O/R with the enforcement file #.

It appears that you have provided clarification to the Nutrien Operation Manager on some of the guidelines they need to follow. Hopefully they clean up their operation which will minimize the complaints from Mr. Brown and family.

I note you suggested that a CO would inspect their business, but in talking to Colin and Dan, they do not have the expertise in what is required for these types of businesses. They can drive by, see what is there and not really know if what they see is a concern. If they are not loading/unloading at the time, there will be no dust and even if there were, is it a technical/legal problem?

I would suggest that if this continues, we make arrangements for an EPO (familiar with Industrial operations and waste) to accompany one of our officers and attend the business location. The EPO staff have the technical expertise and our uniform staff provide the support to show the operators the Ministry is serious. In the past that has proven to provide the best results. At the same time, we meet with the complaint and clarify his understanding of what is acceptable or not. Sometimes people just have to accept what their neighbors are doing.
