SARRS is seeking your approval to proceed with stage 2 of developing a recovery strategy for Eastern Wolf in Ontario.

An external vendor was procured in January 2025 to develop an updated recovery strategy for Eastern Wolf, and they completed a first draft in April 2025. Stage 2 involves seeking review from OPS program areas and federal agencies to ensure technical and scientific accuracy based on the best available information on the species. The vendor will then consider all comments to produce a clean second draft.

The proposed approach aligns with SARB's approach to two other recovery strategies which are in development (for 3 migratory bats and Northern Oak Hairstreak), and with Director-approved messaging that was recently sent to the vendors for those strategies (*see attached email*). The proposed approach for those strategies is to complete stage 2, but **to withhold any public posting** on the Environmental Registry of Ontario until further direction is given, as recovery strategies are no longer required under the amended ESA now that Bill 5 has passed. This approach is also in alignment with the agreement with the vendor, which identifies stage 3 will only proceed at the Ministry's sole discretion.

This approach will leave the Ministry with a complete updated draft-final RS for this SAR, which can be used (if needed) as the basis for some new Conservation Guidance for the species down the road, once the Ministry has selected its new streamlined approach to issuing conservation guidance, when and where it is most needed.

Language regarding recovery strategy requirements under the amended ESA has been included in the email memos to reviewers (*attached Word doc*) for improved clarity.
